ASCEF Automotive Scholarships for High School Seniors, College Students Now Available

SACRAMENTO – The Automotive Services Council Education Foundation (ASCEF) today announced that the application for their various automotive scholarships are now available online.

“For over a decade, ASCEF has awarded educational scholarships to current and aspiring automotive students to help lessen the financial burden on them and their families,” said ASCEF Executive Director Gloria Peterson. “We are proud that 15 years after our founding, we have grown to offer 15 different scholarships to the future leaders of the automotive repair industry.”

The Automotive Services Council of California (ASCCA), the parent organization of ASCEF, began awarding scholarships until they formally established the education foundation in 2000. Since then, the foundation has awarded 127 scholarships for a total of \$89,000.

Each scholarship ranges from \$1,000 - \$2,000, and is awarded to qualified California high school seniors who plan to enroll in post-high school technical/academic training, or California college undergraduates in the automotive service field who satisfy certain criteria.
